Literature (Minor, B.A.)

B.A. with concentrations in Creative Writing, Pre- and Early Modern Studies, Modern Literary Studies, World Literature and Cultural Studies, English Language Literatures, French Literature, German Literature, Greek and Latin Literatures, Italian Literature, Spanish/Latin American/ Latino Literatures.

Major Requirements: 12 courses; senior comprehensive requirement can be satisfied by seminar or thesis. Lower Division Requirements: LIT 1 – Literary Interpretation; a LIT 61 series course – categories, methodologies and problems of literary study, or a LIT 80 series course – topical, thematic, and comparative study of literary texts.

Also required is completion of the literature language proficiency requirement: one year (three quarters or the equivalent) of college level study of a non-English language or demonstrated reading ability at this level

Philosophy (Minor, B.A.)

Major Requirements: 11 courses, including 1 advanced seminar Lower Division Requirements: 2 intro courses: PHIL 9 - Intro to Logic; and either PHIL 11 - Intro to Philosophy, PHIL 22 - Intro to Ethics, PHIL 24 Intro to Ethical Theory. Minor requirements: 9 of the 11 courses required for the major (PHIL 180H, PHIL195A and B, PHIL 199, and PHIL 199F. Any courses worth less than five credits may not be used to fulfill the minor requirements. At least five of those required must be upper-division courses.
