

William Finnegan has been a staff writer at *The New Yorker* since 1987. He has written primarily about politics, war, poverty, race, U.S. foreign policy, organized crime, mass transit, economic globalization, and surfing. His work has appeared in *Granta*, *Harper's*, *The New York Review of Books*, and *The New York Times*, as well as *The New Yorker*. He has published four books of international and domestic reporting and a memoir, *Barbarian Days: A Surfing Life*, which won the Pulitzer Prize for Autobiography in 2016.
